







How We Help Our Clients

For many people, achieving basic safety, shelter, food, health care, and opportunity requires engaging with the legal system. And for many, that means they need a lawyer or legal information that GHLA provides.

To a family facing the loss of their home or the rent subsidy that enables them to care for their disabled family member in decent housing, we say:

“We’ll stand with you in court, advocating for your legal rights and the fair processes that are due to you under the law.”

To the survivor of domestic violence and sexual trafficking, who is relating these traumas for the very first time, to us, as she seeks a restraining order against her abuser, we say:

“We’re here with you—we’ll help you tell your story to the judge in open court, so you can get the protection you need.”

And to the grandparent raising grandchildren whose Food Stamps were cut through an agency error, we say:

“We’ll get this problem solved together. Your children’s future is important to our shared future.”

Advocacy to Meet Basic Human Needs and Safeguard Due Process

PROTECTED VICTIMS OF DOMESTIC VIOLENCE

In our second year with a dedicated court office space, GHLA provided lawyers to help indigent restraining order applicants in Hartford's Family Court, with the State's busiest restraining order docket. Applicants face complex legal, family, and safety issues—in addition to poverty—that require a domestic violence-knowledgeable attorney to analyze and provide legal services. A restraining order is a highly effective safety strategy for some victims.

DEFENDED TENANTS AT RISK OF BEING EVICTED

GHLA leads the Statewide Eviction Right to Counsel Program in Greater Hartford, providing individual representation to hundreds of individuals facing the traumatic disruption and long-term collateral consequences of eviction. Through this extensive representation, GHLA also identified and addressed systemic barriers to housing stability, habitability, and fair court processes.


IMPROVED HOUSING CONDITIONS IN HARTFORD

GHLA represented dozens of individual tenants in housing conditions legal claims, enforcing their rights to safe, livable homes. We also worked with City of Hartford Mayor Arulampalam and Housing Code Enforcement to inform tenants about their rights to habitable rental housing and the systems to enforce these rights.

PROCURED STABLE INCOME FOR PEOPLE WITH DISABILITIES WHO CANNOT WORK

GHLA procured Supplemental Security Income (SSI) benefits for dozens of people with disabilities who cannot work, but whose disabilities are challenging to prove to the Social Security Administration. After multiple denials by the SSA and extensive development of the records, our advocacy achieves grants of monthly benefits—giving clients the security and stability necessary to manage their health conditions and support themselves and their families. One such client was abused as a child by her father and subsequently by intimate partners as an adult, and raised her family while working in hotel housekeeping all her life. After GHLA's dogged advocacy, the judge found that our client was eligible for benefits and disabled since 2020, and will receive retroactive and ongoing benefits.

GHLA is the legal aid organization in Greater Hartford providing the full range of substantive advocacy for priority legal needs of low-income people through their life span.



Systemic Advocacy to Strengthen Community and Improve Access to Justice

PURSUED FAIRNESS IN STATE'S EVICTION COURT SYSTEM

GHLA worked to increase fairness in the justice system, including for people who must participate in the system without a lawyer by their side. GHLA has advocated small, common-sense steps—such as aligning discovery timelines with eviction court’s shortened timelines and requiring landlords to provide leases and rent ledgers prior to mediation—to help bridge the knowledge and power gap between people represented by a lawyer and those defending themselves in a complex court process without one. GHLA will continue to press for measures that ensure basic due process and fairness in the court system.

ENSURED RIGHTS FOR TENANTS IN LARGE HOUSING AUTHORITY

GHLA and its pro bono co-counsel, Day Pitney LLP, continue to represent a proposed class of tenants in low-income public housing seeking final resolution in the federal case *Wright et al. v. Housing Authority of the City of Hartford*, which involves due process protections for low-income public housing tenants.

IMPLEMENTED CITY RENTAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

To comprehensively address the eviction crisis in Connecticut, providing lawyers in eviction cases is not enough. Renters pay significantly higher rents in Connecticut compared to pre-pandemic, which disproportionately impacts renters with low incomes. Strategies, in addition to representation in court, are necessary. The City of Hartford granted GHLA \$1 million for rental assistance for Hartford tenants represented by GHLA in evictions or housing conditions cases. These funds assisted dozens of families in retaining their housing or securing an adequate alternative. The funds, administered pro bono by Shipman & Goodwin, also allow GHLA to gauge the effects of the “lawyer + money” intervention on the crisis of high eviction rates.




